Did the student have special challenges or hurdles while still achieving high academic success?(125-250 words) I was diagnosed with Benign Rolandic Epilepsy as a sixth grader. Unfortunately, we do not know how long this condition had been going on before my diagnosis. We only know that my grades started dropping. We attributed this to me being at a new school and normal teenage drama. It wasn't until my mother actually found me seizing one night that we sought medical help. With my diagnosis, we began to understand how this condition contributed to my grades dropping. The condition would cause me to seize at night and not be able to get a proper sleep pattern. Once I started treatment, my grades started turning around and I then became very focused to get A's like I did before the seizures affected me. Not only did I begin to turn my grades around, but I also decided that I wanted to try out for the varsity volleyball team. I made the team as a seventh grader, while still being treated for my epilepsy and I have lettered every year since. I was fortunate enough to outgrow my epilepsy and I no longer require treatment. However, I know how lucky I am and that some are not that lucky. I hope to use my personal experience to make me a better teacher. I never gave up hope that I could overcome the obstacle placed before me and I continue to strive to be better and do better every day.
