What is an Individualized Graduation Plan (IGP)

The Individualized Graduation Plan or IGP is a state requirement for all 8th grade through 12th grade students. The Education and Economic Development Act (EEDA) of 2005 stipulates that students will have career assessments and awareness activities that help them select a career path. The purpose of the IGP is to assist students with the transition from middle school to high school and to prepare a career major for high school and beyond.

Assessments and Career Exploration

During the IGP conference, students will identify the career majors offered in Marion County School District and match it with their career goal. Students will also learn what areas they need to develop in order to attain college entrance admission requirements. IGP's are adjusted annually to allow for a student's continued academic growth and career exploration throughout high school.

- 4 units of English

- 3 units of Social Studies (US History, Government/Economics and 1 other)
- 1 unit of Physical Education, JROTC or Marching Band
- 1 unit of Computer Science
- 1 unit of a World Language
- 7 units of Elective Classes.
